



Carrot Grow Kit Guide

So you got yourself a Grow Kit! Congrats!

We've included this handy guide for you to make your growing experience simple and fun. Follow these steps, and you'll be watching healthy plants grow in no time!



CONTENTS

- GeoPlanter Fabric Raised Bed - 36" x 16" x 14"
- Geoflora BLOOM Organic Fertilizer - 4 lb / 2 kg



SETUP

Container:

Assemble your GeoPlanter following [these instructions](#) in the area where you would like to set it up.

Placement:

Place your filled GeoPlanter in a location that receives full sun at least 6 hrs per day for your carrots to thrive! GeoPlanter has porous fabric sides, so any excess water will drain out of the pot. Be sure to choose a spot where excess water can drain away properly without resulting in standing water.

Soil:

Fill your GeoPlanter with your desired growing media. Choose whatever soil you're comfortable with! You can check out our [GeoPlanter Volume Chart](#) for more information.



PLANTING

Planting Seeds:

To plant carrot seeds, make a shallow furrow in the soil about 1/4" deep and sprinkle your seeds, covering lightly with soil. Water and keep the soil moist until the seeds sprout.



PLANT CARE

Watering:

Water your plants every two or three days to keep the soil evenly moist. If the plants dry out more quickly due to hot weather, water every day as needed.

Because GeoPlanter Raised Beds have superior aeration, they may require more frequent watering. It's always a good idea to check your soil moisture levels by sticking your finger in up to your first knuckle. If the soil feels damp to the touch, your plant doesn't need water. If it's dry, your plant is thirsty!

Fertilizing:

Geoflora comes in both VEG and BLOOM, which have similar ingredients in different ratios. We've chosen Geoflora BLOOM because it's the best all-purpose fertilizer for your carrot grow!

Amend your soil prior to planting by mixing 2 cups of Geoflora with the soil in the container and watering it in 24-48 hrs before transplant. For carrots, you won't need to fertilize again.

Do not mix with water to apply—Geoflora is not water-soluble.

Manicuring:

Thin your bed of weak shoots after germination of the seeds to ensure the strongest plants are allowed the best chance to grow. Once the seedlings reach about 3" in height, thin them again until there is 1" of space between the seedlings. Don't forget to pull or trim seedlings that are yellowing or showing signs of disease, too!

Harvest:

Your carrots will be ready for harvest about 60-80 days after sowing the seeds. Look for carrot tops sticking out of the soil that are vibrant in color. Be sure to check the instructions for your specific cultivar, as some carrots come in colors other than orange!

Now that you've got everything you need, it's time to get growing!
